Note on ship builder Paul Rodgers (1834 – 1901)

Rodgers was apprenticed for six years to Carrickfergus Shipyard in 1852. Carrickfergus is a town in County Antrim, Northern Ireland, on the north shore of Belfast Lough, 11 miles from Belfast. In 1841 Carrickfergus Shipyard had 3 shipwrights; by 1851 there were 23. In 1862 Rodgers was appointed foreman, and in 1870 became owner of the yard. He designed and built ships, his first being the *Accrington Lass* launched in 1874. He used iron, cheaply supplied from Belfast, which produced larger, more durable ships. www.ulsterhistory.co.uk/rodgers.htm
